

# EUROPEAN *Latsis* PRIZE 2002

## *Invitation* TO NOMINATE CANDIDATES

The European Science Foundation invites nominations for the European Latsis Prize 2002. The Prize, of a value of 100 000 Swiss Francs, is presented each year by the Latsis Foundation at the ESF Annual Assembly to a scientist or research group in recognition of outstanding and innovative contributions in a selected field of European research. The research field for the 2002 Prize is:

### “Cognitive Sciences”

The Cognitive Sciences study the human mind and the nature of intelligence through interactions among the disciplines of psychology, linguistics, anthropology, computer science, neuroscience and biology. The Prize will be awarded for outstanding multidisciplinary contributions to the understanding of human intelligence as a whole or any of its component mechanisms.



The criteria used in the selection procedure will be scientific excellence, societal impact and contribution to European progress.

Nominations may be received for individual scientists or for research groups, but no self-nominations will be accepted. Curricula Vitae of the nominees and, where relevant, abridged list of publications, should be attached to the nomination statements. Proposers are however requested not to send any additional documentation.

The European Latsis Prize 2002 will be awarded on the occasion of the Annual Assembly of the European Science Foundation on Thursday 28 November 2002, in Strasbourg.

The names will be announced in the next issue of the *Latsis* Prize.

### Nomination Statement

This should be completed in no more than 3 pages describing the candidate's qualifications for the European Latsis Prize. A Curriculum Vitae of the candidate should be included with the Nomination Statement.

The Nomination Statement should cover:

- (a) The merit of an individual or group's work on the present state of cognitive sciences
- (b) The impact on the scientific community of the work of the individual candidate or group nominated
- (c) Recognition by peers within the scientific community
- (d) Influence on practice in the field through publications and other means of dissemination, including teaching and training students in the field
- (e) All nominations should be accompanied by a Curriculum Vitae (2 pages maximum and, if relevant, abridged list of publications) of the candidate.

**All applications should include nomination form, nomination statement, and Curriculum Vitae.**
