This should be contained in no more than 3 pages describing the condidate's qualifications for the European Latsis Prize. A Corriculum Vitae of the condidate should be included with the Nationalian Statement.

The Namination Statement should cover:

- (a) The metit of an individual or group's work on the present state of cognitive sciences
- (b) The impact on the scientific community of the work of the individual condicate or group nominated
- (c) Recognition by beers within the scientific community
- (a) influence on practice in the field through politications and other means of dissemination, radiating teaching and training students in the field.
- (e) All normations should be accompanied by a Correction Vitae 12 garges maximum and, if relevant abridged list of publications) at the canadage.

All applications should include nomination form, nomination statement, and Curriculum Vitae.
