Preface

In accordance with § 64 (3) of the Universities Act, the admission to a Master's programme is contingent upon the successful completion of a relevant Bachelor's programme, or University of Applied Sciences Bachelor's programme, or other equivalent programme at a recognised domestic or foreign post-secondary educational institution. Where equivalence has been established in principle and only certain supplementary qualifications are required for full equivalence, the Rectorate shall be entitled to tie the determination of equivalence to examinations to be taken during the respective Master's programme.

Definition of "relevant Bachelor's programme"

The following Bachelor's degree programmes at the University of Klagenfurt are considered to be relevant in any case and can be studied without additional conditions: Applied Informatics, Informatics, Applied Cultural Studies, English and American Studies, Information Management, Information and Communications Engineering and Media and Communications. In the event of the successful completion of a different relevant Bachelor's degree programme or Diploma degree programme, or University of Applied Sciences Bachelor's programme, it is also possible to gain admittance to this Master's degree programme. Relevant Bachelor's degree programmes or Diploma degree programmes or, respectively, University of Applied Sciences Bachelor's programmes are Bachelor's degree programmes in the field of cultural studies, social sciences or media studies, Bachelor's degree programmes in the field of computer science, information technology, information management, English studies or media and communication studies or comparable degree programmes completed at a domestic or foreign university, University of Applied Sciences, or other recognised post-secondary educational institution.

As the Master's degree programme in Game Studies and Engineering is taught exclusively in English, proof of English language skills at level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is required. The Rectorate may regulate admission by means of an admission procedure pursuant to § 63a (8) of the Universities Act.

Frequent transfers

Graduates from the following Bachelor's programmes or University of Applied Sciences Bachelor's programmes frequently transfer to the Master's degree programme:

Please note that in the event of the positive completion of elective subjects in the above-mentioned areas, it may nonetheless be possible, under certain circumstances, to gain admittance without conditions.

Please note that the admission to the Master's degree programme is also possible on the basis of other Bachelor's programmes and University of Applied Sciences Bachelor's programmes. The examples listed above do not claim to be exhaustive.
