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

Course Types

VO – Vorlesung/Lecture

 exam at the end of term (can be taken more than once)

KS – Kurs/Course

exam at the end of term (can only be taken once)

PK – Portfoliokurs

 collection of assessments and exercises over the course of the term

PS – Proseminar

short paper at the end of term

SE – Seminar

same rules as the proseminar but longer paper

Curriculum - Important terminology

ECTS: European Credit Transfer System

1 ECTS = 25h/semester

- 180 ECTS for Bachelor's degree
- 240 ECTS for Bachelor's degree Lehramt
- 120 ECTS for Master's degree

30 ECTS/semester (minimum duration of study)



Curriculum - Important terminology

• Prerequisites:

some courses require the completion of others (e.g. "Language Awareness I" for "Language Awareness II")

(p. 13 – English version; p. 13/14 – German version)

Lectures (= Vorlesung) vs. Continuous
 Assessment Courses (= prüfungsimmanente
 Lehrveranstaltung)

(p. 8 – English version; p. 9 – German version)



Curriculum - Important terminology

- Lectures (= Vorlesung)
 - VO
 - attendance recommended but not mandatory
 - exam (multiple dates/attempts possible)
 - e.g.: Introduction to Linguistics I
- Continuous Assessment Courses
 - (= prüfungsimmanente Lehrveranstaltung)
 - KS, PS, SE, PK
 - mandatory attendance
 - continuous assessment (final exam cannot be repeated!)
 - e.g.: Introduction to Literary Studies



Important terminology

CEFR – Common European Framework of Reference for Languages

 guideline to describe achievements of learners of foreign languages in Europe

[...] B2, C1, C2 – levels of language proficiency

- A1/A2 "Basic User"
- B1/B2 "Independent User"
- C1/C2 "Proficient User"

Required Entry Level = B2+ = a minimum of 75 pts. on the Placement Test

M.A Curriculum – Programme Structure

- Required Subject: 10 ECTS
 - Defining essential questions of a subject areas
 - Developing individual research question
 - Knowledge of suitable methods of analysis
- Electives: 56 ECTS
 - critically explaining and applying selected methods in areas of linguistics OR English-speaking cultures and literatures
 - placing these concepts in the larger context of linguistics OR Anglophone cultural and literary studies

M.A Curriculum – Programme Structure

- Optional Subjects: 12 ECTS
 - Can be chosen freely from the courses offered by recognised domestic and foreign universities
- Master's Thesis 30 ECTS
 - Must comprise 30,000+/- words (main text)
 - Not connected to a specific course
 - Can be started in the first semester (find a topic, find a supervisor)
 - Account for deadlines (grading, exam, submission, etc) near graduation

M.A Curriculum – Programme Structure

- Comprehensive Examination: 12 ECTS
 - Covers two subject areas from the specialisation
 - One relates to the master's thesis and also contains further questions
 - The other can be freely chosen (within the specialisation)


