Code of Conduct



for Studies of the Faculty of Technical Sciences

Status: 1.3.2024

The University of Klagenfurt is a place of learning, teaching, research and work. The Faculty of Technical Sciences promotes respectful interaction between university members and does not tolerate any form of discrimination.

Good conduct means but is not restricted to:

- Recognizing and valuing the diversity of the university community and not discriminating against others. Diversity includes intersectional elements of age, gender, sexual orientation, ethnic origin, nationality, culture, language, religious faith, illness, disability and more.
- Refrain from any offensive behavior, bullying, harassment, or emotional blackmail
 both in person and on the internet, including email, virtual learning environments,
 social networking sites, blogs and other web resources, course feedback. Such
 behavior is unacceptable towards any person, including teachers and fellow
 students, and the university will take the necessary steps (criminal charges if
 necessary).
- **Being considerate of others** so as to create a positive, respectful and supportive environment, free of all discrimination and intimidation.
- **Using non-discriminatory language in all communication,** including writing and speaking.
- Use a polite tone, appropriate to the academic nature of the institution.
- Caring for our shared university environment by

 - o acting in an environmentally responsible manner.
